What is a BOARD CERTIFIED VETERINARY DERMATOLOGIST®?

A **BOARD CERTIFIED VETERINARY DERMATOLOGIST®** is a veterinarian that has undergone additional training and education after veterinary school to become a specialist in their field. This training consists of a minimum of a yearlong internship program followed by a three-year residency program that meets guidelines established by the American College of Veterinary Dermatology (ACVD). During the veterinary residency, veterinarians must meet specific clinical and research requirements. In addition to these requirements, they must have research they performed published in a scientific journal and pass a rigorous examination. Specialists in veterinary dermatology are called a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Dermatology or a **BOARD CERTIFIED VETERINARY DERMATOLOGIST®**.

What Should I Expect on the Day of My Pet's Procedure?

Drop-off on the day of your pet's procedure is no later than 8:00 am. We ask that all patients arrive this early because preoperative exams and anesthesia preparation need be performed prior to starting our day. Procedures are typically performed mid to late morning. You can expect to hear from the dermatologist near the end of the procedure to discuss results, patient status, and next steps if needed. Most patients can go home the same day of the procedure. We will keep your pet under our care for monitoring after sedation or anesthesia to ensure they are able to go home safely.
